#### Lessons of the Front Porch Fellowship

Although my Williamsport neighborhood (the houses around 449 Wilson St.) is nothing very special to see, I have felt blessed to be part of six summers of front porch fellowship on my block. The single, married and widowed women living around me know the neighborhood and revel in the company there. There are few reasons large enough to keep everyone from at least some enjoyment of the warm summer evenings - especially if accompanied by a light breeze - from the front porch bench, swing, wicker chair or catch-as-catch can porch furniture. Where one neighbor is in view, the rest sometime congregate to spend hours chatting.

Thus it is that I have come to know my neighbor who has never voted (as her husband didn't permit her to do so in the old days, and as she has never thereafter felt the need to learn;) one woman who raised her family in the neighborhood, including a child who is now a priest; a woman who has lived in her home 81 years, that is, since she was born in the same home and another who has been a pillar of her congregation and has even helped me, on occasion, with my tasks at St. Luke.

For the most part, these women have spent their lives in a domestic sphere, where they have not been able to shape or influence the world with ideas and theory, or participate in the business of society or manage the ties of commerce. Therefore, In some ways, it's hard to relate the very document that is to speak about them, to them - a social statement on Women and Justice, a church document that is being readied for the ELCA Assembly in Milwaukee next year. The world of ideas undergirds this document that defines patriarchy and sexism and suggests responses of the church to act justly when it comes to women.

It calls us, as Lutheran Christians, to act justly within the home, church, society and in civic life. It recognizes that patriarchal systems happen where men are typically viewed as "better than women, given more power than women and have more authority than women." (II, lines 83, 84.) Sexism is the reinforcement of male privilege. (line 85)

What should we do about sexism? The statement emphasizes hope in society and in the church. Specifically

- that we respect the human and civil rights of all
- that we eradicate gender-based violence
- that we stop objectifying or stereotyping people
- that we advocate access to health care systems for all
- that we support practices, policies and regulations that enhance equality and equity for girls and women.....and other initiatives.
- In the church, it suggests that we must affirm the gifts that women and girls bring to congregations and it lists several initiatives here, as well.

Perhaps my porch conversations with the neighbors this summer will explore how societal structures and intellectual assumptions named in the document have indeed shaped our lives. Perhaps we'll ponder, as well, whether men now feel liberated enough from the straightjacket of rigid sex and gender expectations (which, for men, have often precluded the option of choosing a domestic role.) The draft on *Women and Justice* will be refined this fall, having been deliberated by the whole church. At the 2019 Churchwide Assembly it will need a 2/3 vote for passage. Stay tuned for summer, 2019, and enjoy your summer chats.
