Time for a Reboot?

First of all, I'd like to thank those of you who showered me with goodies during the last few weeks of December. There were so many gifts of "the three c's" (cards, cookies, and candies), that it began to get hard to keep track of who gave what! So, please let this note serve as my sincere thanks to all who gave goodies this Christmas season!

Here's the thing, though. As delicious as it all was, I'm starting to go through something that I suspect most of us experience this time of year. My waistline (not to mention my bathroom scale) is starting to tell me something: it may be time for a change in eating habits. It may be time ... for a reboot.



Okay, the choice of the word "may" is probably a bit generous. It **IS** time for a reboot. I don't want to speak for anyone else, but in my case, it is definitely time for some changes back to a more healthy routine. But just as the new year is a popular time for us to reset our fitness habits, it's also a good time for us to take stock of where we are spiritually. The easiest way of doing that is to ask ourselves how we are doing at what Jesus called "the greatest commandments". Are we loving God with all of our hearts, souls, and minds? And are we loving our neighbors as ourselves?

None of us is perfect. Even at the best of times, it does not take much reflection to find examples in our lives where the answer is "no". But the good news of the gospel is that we do not earn salvation this way. It has already been won for us by the one whose birth we just celebrated. It is, however, how we grow in relationship and show our gratitude for the Savior. So, it's never a bad idea to recommit ourselves with the occasional reboot.

As such, I'd like to offer you something from my United Methodist heritage that can help us kick off a "spiritual reboot": John Wesley's covenant prayer*. This prayer is part of a more comprehensive worship service that some United Methodists still observe at the start of the year. I share it with you along with my prayers that we will all grow in Christ in the coming year:

"I am no longer my own, but thine. Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee, exalted for thee or brought low for thee. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal. And now, O glorious and blessed God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it. And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen."
