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"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?"

- God (as found in Isaiah 43:19)

At one of the churches I used to be associated with, someone once asked me why another church in the community seemed to attract so many more people than our church did. While I wasn't extremely familiar with that church, I ventured a few guesses: The church in question had altered their worship style to one that was more accessible to unchurched people. They offered strong volunteer-led ministries, most notably offering programming for children and youth. They had a strong small groups network that helped to strengthen both fellowship and personal faith growth. In general, they were willing to change their status quo – the "way we've always done it" – in order to reach more people.



My questioner stood silent for a moment, appearing to mull my answers. Finally, the response came: "Yeah, but how come their church attracts so many people and ours doesn't?" It was as if my thoughts on the matter had never been spoken. Like the council in the above cartoon, that person had a paradoxical desire for transformation without change.

You might recognize that I told that story in my sermon on July 21 (print copies are available in the office). In short, my main point in that sermon was this: while we often hope for God to give birth to something new in our midst, we aren't always ready to experience the "labor pains" that come with that birth.

There is no magic bullet to promise automatic growth. Any of the ideas I mentioned above can easily fail, especially if there's no accompanying effort to build relationship or truly engage with the community. Nonetheless, churches who desire to grow need to be open to changes that allow them to make new connections with people.

For some, that type of change might mean letting go of some of the ways things used to be done. For others, it might mean making a greater investment in the ministry of the church, whether that be through gifts, time, or talent. As your interim pastor, I'm not about to cast a specific vision in which this might happen, but I **do** feel comfortable telling you that it probably **should** happen on some level.

So, as the time and talent sheets are distributed in the coming months, I hope that you'll consider the following questions as you review them. Of course, I'll hope you'll consider whether God is calling you to join one of our existing ministries, but I hope you'll pray on these as well.

- Might any of our existing ministries be changed to better meet the needs of the community?
- Might there be new ministries to meet new needs?

May God continue to bless your summer season as we head into the fall!
