The Already, But Not Yet

As I write, it is a time of waiting and expectation. It is late March, and while the temperatures have risen a bit, the trees are still mostly bare, the flowers have yet to bloom, and the nights are still rather frigid. We have already begun to experience a promise of spring, but it is not here yet.

We are also still in the season of Lent, and while some of the scripture passages on Sunday and at our midweek services have begun to focus less on our sinfulness and more on God's goodness, we have not yet arrived at the resurrection. We have begun to dwell on the promise of Easter, but it is not here yet.

These experiences are in many ways reminiscent of the Christian life, where we experience hints of God's full and final redemption in the midst of the realities of life. Theologians refer to this as the "already but not yet". We have already begun to experience the many blessings of God. We see glimpses of the kingdom through beauty, both in nature and in the creativity of humanity. We get a taste of what it is to be in communion with God when we experience the love of others. And we participate in the building of the kingdom whenever we demonstrate charity and advocate for justice.

But that kingdom is not here yet. Injustice still exists. We experience – sometimes firsthand, and sometimes through observation – tragic events and incredible cruelty. It can sometimes feel as though we live our lives on Good Friday. But Easter is coming.

Whether we are currently experiencing kingdom glimpses or facing a time of difficulty, my hope is that we will all take hope in the promise of the coming of the resurrected Christ.

Quintessential Baroque: Music of Bach and Handel Williamsport Chamber Choir and Orchestra Daniel J. Hall, conductor

With guest Baroque artists: Matthew Hall and Elizabeth Lyon, harpsichord and Baroque cello (Cornell University), Beth Anne Kelley, Baroque flautist (Chicago)

The Williamsport Chamber Choir and Orchestra are excited to perform to highly contrasting works of the Baroque period at St. Luke's Lutheran Church in Williamsport, PA on Saturday, April 13, 7:30 PM.

J.S. Bach's *Coffee Cantata* (BWV 211) is a rare look in to the whimsical and comedic side of this master composer. During his time in Leipzig, Bach regularly directed a musical ensemble based at Zimmermann's coffee house. His libretto suggests that some people in eighteenth-century Germany viewed coffee drinking as a bad habit. The cantata's libretto features lines like "If I couldn't, three times a day, be allowed to drink my little cup of coffee, in my anguish, I will turn into a shriveled-up roast goat". It is composed for continuo and three soloists who play the roles of narrator, father, and daughter.

G.F. Handel's *Dixit Dominus* (HWV 232) is truly one of the pillars of sacred Baroque music. Built on the Latin text of Psalm 110, the music is dramatic and virtuosic. The work was completed in April 1707 while Handel was living in Italy. Premiered when he was only 21 years old, it is Handel's earliest surviving autograph.
