#### From the Pastor's Desk

"... Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart." – Luke 2:19

Ninety miles. That is how far Mary and Joseph travelled from their home in Nazareth to their ancestral home, Bethlehem. There, by law, they were required to participate in a census. To put it in perspective, ninety miles is roughly the same as the distance from Williamsport to my hometown of Altoona. I have travelled back there many times since leaving. The trip takes just under two hours by automobile. To make the trip on foot would be doable, but it's not a trip I'd be anxious to take. I certainly would not want to do it with a pregnant woman, and I can't even imagine what it would be like to undertake such a journey **as** a pregnant woman.

And yet, that is how Joseph and Mary prepared for the birth of the savior of the world.

The trip from Nazareth to Bethlehem takes one largely the Judean desert, but even deserts get cold temperatures in the winter. They also would have travelled through the heavily forested And when traveling through the heavily forested Jordan River valley, which brought the threat of predators, not to mention bandits and thieves.

And yet this is how Joseph and Mary prepared for the coming of God's Son.

And when they arrived at Bethlehem, they might normally have expected to stay with a Jewish family, but the sheer size of the crowd participating in the census forced them to seek accommodations at an inn. Many scholars believe that the "stable" at which they eventually arrived was actually a cave used for housing animals like mules and sheep. It might have protected them from the elements, but it was hardly clean and comfortable.

And yet, this is how Mary and Joseph prepared for the advent of Jesus.

Their experience reminds us that God comes to us in the midst of life. Even when life is messy. Hard. Uncomfortable. And not only does God come to us in those circumstances, the love of God is so great that God *shares* in those circumstances with us.

This Christmas has the potential to be messy, hard, and uncomfortable. At the time of this writing, we are facing great uncertainty as to whether we will hold in-person worship during the Advent and even Christmas seasons. All I can tell you at this time is that we will likely follow whatever recommendations come from the state and/or the Synod.

And so, just as I attempted in last month's newsletter to bring you encouragement in the face of a possible worst-case Thanksgiving scenario, here I am again.

And here's the hope. The conditions for Mary and Joseph dealt with were indeed a difficult way for them to prepare for Jesus. But he did come. And so he will for us. Whatever we face in the coming months, know that Jesus will be among us!

### **Advent and Christmas Worship**

Please note that this schedule is flexible, pending developments. The following precautions will be lovingly taken at all worship services in December to protect each other:

- Masks are required and will be provided.
- Singing will be limited (1-2 verses per hymn)
- Distancing will be requested (only every other pew will be used and family group will be asked to maintain a six-foot distance)

#### Midweek Advent Services

There will be a short in-person prayer service on December 2, 9 and 16 in the Nave at 7 p.m. This service will be livestreamed.

#### **Christmas Eve**

Our current plan is to hold at least one in-person Christmas Eve service at 7:30 p.m. The service will be livestreamed, and 30 minutes after its conclusion there will be an extended period (10-15 minutes) of outdoor carol singing in the front parking lot/yard approximately 30 minutes after the service concludes to which all are invited.

Originally it was thought that we might limit the in-person worship to certain groups and require all others to participate in the livestream/outdoor caroling option. However, after discussing the issue, the Worship and Music ministry felt it best to find some balance between safety and inclusion.



So, in order to determine the desire for in-person attendance, we are asking you to let us know <u>by December 15</u> if you plan to attend on Christmas Eve. Depending on the interest shown, we may add an additional service to accommodate all.

#### December 27 - Online Service of Lessons and Carols

The Sunday after Christmas is traditionally a service of lessons and carols, with no sermon. 
