From the Pastor's Desk:

Back to the Basics

Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. – 2 Timothy 1: 13

Most of the careers of my life have involved some level of ongoing training. For example, when I was a teacher, I was expected to participate in in-service days, where the students got the day off while the teachers participated in various workshops. When I worked at Lycoming College, I attended the annual conference of the National Association of College and University Chaplains, and often attended workshops held on campus as well. And, of course, as a pastor, I occasionally take part in various continuing education opportunities offered by the Synod, the national church, or even ecumenical organizations.

For all three jobs, the goal of such training would sometimes be to provide new information or to learn new practices, such as to introduce a new teaching technique, or to learn about the trends of the current generation of college students. Other times, the focus would simply be to reinforce knowledge and practices that may have grown dull over time, like a workshop on boundary training or a refresher on church policy.

These sorts of things could, of course, vary in quality, with the worst of them being tremendous wastes of time. But when done well, and when focused on an actual need, they could be very beneficial, even refreshing.

It seems to me that our faith can similarly benefit from occasional times of refocusing. Perhaps we could learn from seeing a familiar scripture with new eyes. Or, maybe we just need to sometimes remind ourselves of our dependence on (and the reliability of) the grace of God.

With that in mind, I would like to invite you to consider the upcoming season of Lent as an opportunity for "going back to the basics".

"Coffee and Catechism" (see details elsewhere in this newsletter) will be an opportunity for such a time of training and refreshing as we return to some of the foundational texts and concepts of our faith. This will be no mere exercise in memorization, however, as we will look to explore the ways that these foundational elements of our faith connect with our daily lives. I hope you'll be able to join us!

Thank you. Thank you! It is my joy to report that through your faithfulness in giving, the Shepherd of the Streets ministry has ended 2021 well and is positioned to minister to our current and future clients into 2022. We cannot do what we do without your support. Throughout the past year your support has been incredible! When we have needed hygiene items you have arrived with boxes and bags full to meet the need. Your financial giving has stabilized and strengthened our ability to care for the prescription drug, medical travel, and vision needs of our clients. Your support of our newest offering in the form of our food "blessing table" has also been tremendous. I must give a special shout out to the college students from Lycoming College who have blessed us three times through their food collections. Thank you for all that you do to ensure our ongoing ministry to the needs of our clients.

Allow me to share some "Shepherd Statistics" with you as we close out 2021 and move into 2022. In 2021 we experienced **1,910** client visits to our office. We provided prescription medication assistance **968** times. We funded **174** requests for medical travel assistance. We purchased **55** pairs of glasses and paid for numerous eye examinations. We helped **12** clients to receive needed oral surgeries. We provided baby diapers **155** times and adult diapers **95** times. Finally, we assembled and distributed **805** hygiene kits throughout the year. None of this assistance would be possible without generous contributions from individuals, local churches, the Plankenhorn Foundation, and the United Way. Again, THANK YOU!

As you can see our monthly hygiene kits are extremely popular. We rely upon your donations of specific items for the kits. Our clients can request a kit every 30 days. Why do we provide these kits? Hopefully, the kits enable those who receive them to free up a bit of money in their monthly household budgets. Each item we provide is an item that they do not need to purchase. Listed below are items that are currently needed. It is amazing how our shelves fill up and then quickly empty.
