From the Pastor's Desk:

May 2022

"Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of god in Christ Jesus." -Philippians 3:13-14

This month, on **May 22 (10:30)** we will be honoring our 2022 high school graduates in worship. And, for the first time, we will also be inviting the families of our preschool students to worship on that day as well. The idea came from members of the board, who noted that many of our high school graduates are also themselves alumni of the Pre-school at St. Luke.

This time of year, both high-school seniors **and** pre-schoolers – in their own ways – are on the verge of leaving behind the world they know to begin new journeys in new places with new expectations and expanded horizons. Those of us who have already made those journeys may remember the range of emotions we felt at the time: excitement and apprehension mingling together as we considered both the possibility and the uncertainty of it all.

But those moments don't necessarily end when we stop making transitions in our schooling. I certainly felt that same mixture of excitement when I started at Lycoming College, and when you called me to be your pastor. Perhaps you have your own transitions that you can recall. Sometimes these moments also happen in the life of a church. I believe that we may be at such a time. The last two years have changed us. We look different than we did in early 2020. Not necessarily better or worse, but different. And I believe we look at the world a little differently now, too. As the world continues to open back up, I encourage us to take a look around – to see our congregation and our community with fresh eyes, eager to see new opportunities for ministry and new possibilities for our church.

To that end, on May 14 (2 p.m.), we will be hosting an event of the West Branch Conference of our synod called "Conversations with the Bishop". Churches from over the conference are invited to send both clergy and laity to this event at which we will discuss both what we have been doing and what we *could* be doing for mission and outreach in our respective communities. It's an opportunity to connect with other churches to discuss what we've done and what the future may hold, and it's not just for council members or ministry leaders; it's for everyone who has an interest in exploring the mission and outreach of the church.

But whether you attend this event or not, I hope that we will all, like both our pre-school students and our graduating seniors, be looking towards the future with anticipation and a willingness to receive what God has in store for us!
