#### From the Pastor's Desk:

#### On Vacation?

"If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast."

-Psalm 139:9-10

As the weather improves, many of us have already planned our summer vacations. Whether they are packed with activities or simply a chance to "veg out on the beach", vacations provide us an opportunity to recharge our batteries.

If our vacation keeps us out of town on a Sunday, we might be tempted to take a vacation from worship while we are getting away from everything else.



As surprising as this might seem coming from a pastor, there are times in which a break might be helpful. Volunteer burnout, conflicts, and other problems can make worship a draining experience.

And if we find worship draining, we probably *should* take a step back and spend some time alone with God and others we trust to figure out why.

But here's the thing: for most of us a 'worship vacation' is probably due more to just not wanting to make it a priority. With that in mind, here are some thoughts that I hope will inspire you to find a place to worship while you are away this summer.

- Worshipping elsewhere reminds us of the global nature of the church. The communion table we share is bigger than the one in our own nave.
- Worshipping with complete strangers can be a powerful way to remember that we are part of a larger church.
- Visiting another church gives us the opportunity to experience something new. Whether it's a Lutheran Church with a different style of worship or a completely different denomination (or independent church), experiencing something different can expand our understanding of who God is. And on a similar line of thought ...
- Visiting another congregation can often lead to discovering some really great ideas. Occasionally the new things we experience might be something we want to try ourselves! If you have this experience, please feel free to share them (along with worship bulletins) with me or anyone on Music and Worship!
- Worshipping in a new church gives us insight on what it is like to be an outsider.
  When you're the outsider, the way a congregation makes you feel welcome (or not)
  can be very educational. If you share those lessons back home, it could help make
  St. Luke an even more hospitable place than it already is. Through our collective
  experiences at other churches, we can learn a lot about how to welcome visitors into
  St. Luke.

I hope you'll consider worshipping on vacation if you get the chance this summer. After all, God never takes a vacation from us. Blessings!



## Upper Susquehanna Synod Events

Synod Assembly was this past weekend, with the biggest news that we have elected a new bishop, Pastor Craig Miller, who will start on September 1, 2022.

# August 8-12, 2022: ELCA Churchwide Assembly:

The 2022 ELCA Churchwide Assembly will be held in Columbus, Ohio, August 8-12, at the Greater Columbus Convention Center. The theme is Embody the Word. The ELCA Churchwide Assembly, the primary decision-making body of the church, is a process of communal spiritual discernment. When the ELCA Churchwide Assembly convenes, its voting members meet with confidence in God's grace around word and water, wine and bread, to carry on their work on behalf of the entire church. Over the course of the assembly, voting members:

- · Hear reports and review the work of churchwide officers, leaders and units;
- · Receive and consider proposals from synod assemblies;
- · Elect officers, board members and other leaders as specified by the constitution or bylaws;
- · Establish ELCA churchwide policy;
- · Worship together;
- · Adopt a budget; and
- $\cdot$  Conduct other business related to the ELCA churchwide organization.

The Upper Susquehanna Synod's voting members are: Bishop Collins, VP Holly Fry, Youth Rep. Taylor Brown, Young Adult Rep. Ali Wyland, Diane Bubb, Ray Huff, Rev. Gary Schaeffer and Rev. Tormod Svensson.

#### **August 18, 2022: Next Region 8 Racial Justice Training**

We are called to be a church that embraces each person and confronts racial, ethnic, cultural, religious, age, gender, familial, sexual orientation, physical, personal and class barriers that can manifest as unjust treatment, inequalities, exclusion, and violence. The ELCA's Region 8 is committed to equipping leaders to recognize and understand the complexities and implications of racism and racial issues and is offering training in the areas of anti-racism and racial justice for leaders in partnership with synods, congregations, associations, and social service agencies.

Region 8's Racial Justice Training equips leaders (rostered and lay) to face the challenges of racism in a diverse, complex and changing world by providing tools and resources that foster healthy and holy conversations. Each workshop addresses these aspects of racism:

- 1) Talking about Race: language and vocabulary
- 2) History and systemic racism in the United States, and
- 3) How to begin conversations and actions in your ministry context.

Each training is offered on Zoom using a combination of instruction and small group conversation. Facilitators will represent the region to the extent possible, spearheaded by the Reverend Carla Christopher Wilson. Cost is \$25 per person; however, if cost is a barrier, please contact Marty Shifflett at mshifflett@lss-elca.org, or 717-652-1852, ext. 115. Because we want to make this training as accessible to as many people as possible, if two people from a congregation register, additional participants (beyond 2) from that congregation may attend at no cost. Those additional participants are required to register by contacting Marty Shifflett.

Region 8 is comprised of the following eight synods: Northwest PA, Southwest PA, Allegheny, Lower Susquehanna, Upper Susquehanna, Delaware/Maryland, Metro DC, and West Virginia/Western Maryland.

#### **Mission and Vision**

Our mission is to provide training in baking skills and to offer support and guidance for individuals involved in the criminal justice system. Our vision for the graduates of our program is that they will be able to secure gainful employment and become productive members of our community.

#### **Update**

We have been in operation since February and are now working with our first two trainees. Both are very cooperative, eager to learn, and are meeting expectations well. We presently have a volunteer staff of four (Marty, Wendy, Perry, and Jennifer). We currently are working only one day a week but hope to expand as our customer base grows. Although our product line is growing slowly, we have done well with our first two breads: white and whole wheat sandwich breads. Other breads are in the experimental stage and will be available soon. Jennifer is taking charge of our "pastry division". Under her careful instructions, we have begun baking chocolate chip cookies and blueberry muffins. Yum!

#### **Financial Operation**

Our primary sources of funding are contributions and sales of our baked goods. We anticipate that someday our sales will not only cover our daily expenses but provide needed funds for the expansion of our program. We realize that when we need a bigger facility we will have to also rely on contributions and grant funding.

#### **Marketing**

Word of mouth has been our primary form of publicity and marketing to this point. SO please spread the word of the good work we are doing!! Our next level of marketing is to establish some regular customers at churches, clubs, organizations, and businesses. If your group would like to order on a regular basis (weekly, bi-weekly, or monthly) or for special occasions, please contact us. All we would need from you is one person in your group to accept the responsibility of taking orders and collecting money. Please call us for details.


