PROJECT LINUS

On behalf of the Central Susquehanna Valley Chapter of Project Linus, I want to thank you for your support of our mission of "Providing Security Through Blankets." In 2022 we delivered over 2,000 blankets to sick, injured, and abused children in our 7-county chapter. We couldn't do it without your support. Every September, members of this congregation volunteer their time to make quilts, fleece blankets and crochet together granny squares. Last September, with the help of Lynn Shade and Cindy Belles, I delivered 354 blankets to the chapter headquarters in Lewisburg. It took three vehicles to deliver that many blankets. They went out almost immediately to the Williamsport, Muncy Valley, and Jersey Shore Hospitals. November and December are the biggest times of the year when we get requests for blankets.

Now our inventory is low. There will be a Make a Blanket Day at Faith Lutheran Church, 2349 Old Turnpike Rd. <u>Lewisburg, PA</u> 17837 on April 15, 9:30 am to 2:00 pm to help refill the inventory.

We currently need fleece to make blankets. It can be yard goods for blankets measuring 60x72 or blanket kits. You can get the kits at JoAnn's. There are usually some on the discounted rack. They don't have to be fancy, just something that a child would enjoy snuggling. **There is a box in the West hallway for your donations.** Additionally, if you would like to donate a new handmade blanket, you can also put that in the box. I travel to Lewisburg on the first Saturday and the third Wednesday of the month. *If anyone would like to go with me to see the operation and help sort blankets, prep fleece for Make a Blanket Day, sew on tags, or help with the intake of blankets, or would like more information about Project Linus call me at 503-686-4968 or email me at nauhill2@comcast.net*

Returning Citizens may struggle with obtaining employment, finding suitable housing, health issues, addictions, and mental health issues. On the flip side returning citizens are tax payers, employed and may be sitting beside you on a Sunday morning. They have a history as do all of us. We are all better people than actions or decisions we made on the worst day of our lives. The gospel message is

of forgiveness. Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother when he sins against me? Up to seven times? (Matthew 18:21-22) Of course Jesus tells him Seventy times seven. Although the disciples had been with Jesus for some time, they were still thinking in the limited terms of the law, rather than the unlimited terms of grace and love.
