FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

"I will walk in the presence of the Lord in the land of the living" -Psalm 116:9

I once had a clergy mentor who refused to wear a cross in public. It wasn't because he was ashamed of what he believed. In fact, it was quite the opposite. But he knew that he was never going to be loving and "Christ-like" 100% of the time, and he did not want to take the chance that strangers would observe him in public and, without knowing his professed need for grace, make negative connections between his behavior and Jesus. So, he would not wear a cross, unless he was in church.

Now, that might be a bit of an extreme approach, but I think it's fair to say that none of us is at our "Christian best" at all times. If asked, I imagine that most of us could probably remember a time when we did not display our love of either God or neighbor very well. And I'm even more confident that we have all encountered allegedly "religious" people behaving in ways that belie their professed faith.

During the month of September, our sermons will revolve around the question "What does authentic faith look like?" This series is not intended to provide an exhaustive answer to the question but will rather explore what this month's lectionary passages have to say on the topic. For now, I'll give you a spoiler: authentic faith does not involve perfection, and we need not be perfect in order to consider ourselves Christian. But what *does* it look like? I hope you'll be able to join us for the whole month as we explore how authentic faith in Jesus can be reflected in our lives. Λ

Project Linus provided 995 blankets to the Williamsport Area in 2023, and this number continues to grow each year. In addition to hospitals and foster care agencies, Project Linus now provides blankets to local elementary school guidance departments in Lycoming County.

- 1. It helps replenish the inventory for the fall and winter
- 2. It brings volunteers together, enjoying each other's company.

Alongside making blankets, we will be collecting supplies for our blankets on the 28th such as:

- completed blankets (knitted, crocheted, quilted, or handtied fleece) in any size, fabric for quilts
- batting for quilts
- yarn in bright colors
- fleece blanket kits
- at least 1 1/2 yards of fleece fabric

- quilting thread in any color
- gift cards to Hobby Lobby or JoAnn's fabrics
- your time on the 28th to help make blankets, scan blankets for pins, and sort and bag blankets for transport to the Lewisburg Chapter Closet.


