FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I hope that you had the opportunity to spend some time at our Blueberry Festival last month! Our end-of-summer/fall kick-off event was extremely well attended and was a great time! This event is one of my favorites of the year, for several reasons:

- It was a time to focus on us: it was a fantastic opportunity to both work with and fellowship with members of the St. Luke community!
- It was also a time to focus our neighbors: as much fun as it was spending time with our own folks, it also gave us the opportunity to invite the community through advertising and personal invitations. Lots of fresh faces were introduced to the St. Luke Family that day. The free-will donation for the event also raised money for a worthy cause: Sojourner Truth Ministries, who had several folks in attendance. As I write, the exact amount has not yet been reported, but I know that we will be able to make a gift of well over \$1000 to Sojourner Truth because of the donations received!






Our community's annual walk to fight hunger, the **CROP Walk**, is scheduled for **Sunday**, **October 13**, **2024**. Registration and Walk will begin at 1 p.m. in front of St. Mark's Lutheran Church (142 Market Street). Walkers can walk 3, 6, or 9 miles on the River Walk.

This year is our 46th Walk, and to date, we have raised over 1 million dollars to help stop hunger! Last year we raised almost \$6,000. We hope we can count on your congregation's participation.

Thank you for doing your part to fight hunger both locally and globally. Of the money we raise, 25% goes to our community and is distributed equally among the Jersey Shore Care and Share, the Sonlight House of Muncy, the United Churches of Lycoming County's Food Pantry, and the West End Christian Community Center. The other 75% is distributed by Church World Service nationally and internationally to help hungry people.

FROM BISHOP EATON:

You shall also love the stranger, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt (Deuteronomy 10:19).

Dear church,

The recent national spotlight on Haitian immigrants in Springfield, Ohio, clearly has fanned flames of hate and stoked threats of violence. The rhetoric has created discord and mistrust of people who have already suffered civil unrest in their nation and been granted legal protection in the United States. History shows us that this kind of hatred often carries negative national and global consequences. Our church teaches that immigrants are children of God, made in God's image and worthy of respect and lives of dignity. God calls us to witness boldly to this truth when people tell dehumanizing lies that perpetuate racist tropes and support white supremacist narratives.

As people of faith, we and others look to God's command to "not bear false witness against your neighbor" (Exodus 20:16). Martin Luther explains: "We are to fear and love God, so that we do not tell lies about our neighbors, betray or slander them, or destroy their reputations. Instead we are to come to their defense, speak well of them, and interpret everything they do in the best possible light" (Martin Luther, Small Catechism, Eighth Commandment; *Book of Concord*, page 353).

Recognizing historic discriminatory policies and treatment of African descent immigrants, the ELCA has specific commitments to strengthen advocacy, protection and accompaniment of Black migrants. The ELCA participates in and promotes the United Nations International Decade for People of African Descent. We stand in solidarity with the Haitian community in the United States. We pray alongside Bishop Suzanne Darcy Dillahunt and the Southern Ohio Synod, Wittenberg University and Springfield area

congregations responding to hateful speech and threats of violence in their communities.

Please pray and take action to stop the spread of hate. As followers of Christ, we are called to love neighbors. Below are resources to support this call.

ELCA Social Message on Immigration



From Bishop Miller (Sep 2024)

• September 12, 2024

On September 5, nearly 100 leaders from faith communities across Pennsylvania gathered in Harrisburg to call for peace and civility during this election season. At a press

conference in the Capitol rotunda led off by Bishop Christopher DeForest (Northeast Pennsylvania Synod), speakers from Christian, Jewish, and Muslim communities spoke words of unity, peace, and common concern for our neighbors.

We spoke as one body as we gathered on the steps behind the speakers to say that our government leaders and those who seek elected office must take responsibility for their rhetoric and seek to reduce the possibility for violence as we enter this contentious election season. Our presence that day carried with it the presence of over 330 leaders and members of our religious communities who had signed on to a statement, drafted by the bishops of our seven ELCA synods in Pennsylvania, entitled Choices and Voices for Peace. Even as we spoke that day, more were joining us in our statement.

We continue to call on members of our congregations to add their voices to ours in hope that the violence many fear will mar this election will be overcome with love. You can add your name to the statement by signing on at . If you would like to go further, you might write to your elected leaders to ask them to read and sign the statement as well. Finally, I encourage our congregations to engage in conversations about peaceful dialogue in times of division. The LAMPA website has many resources for use in groups and individually. Let us pray fervently for peace in our nation, our communities, and among our neighbors.
