FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

November, 2024

"You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor" - Exodus 20:16

At the time of the writing of this article, election day is just a few weeks away. By the time this newsletter reaches you, November 5 will either be mere days away, or perhaps already in the past. As I consider that day, the eighth commandment (quoted above) comes to mind.

Much has been said and written about honesty (more specifically the lack of it) in this political season. But that is not why I am focused on this particular commandment. In fact, it's not even "honesty" per se that drew my thoughts to this verse. Instead, I find myself reflecting on Martin Luther's explanation of the commandment, and in particular what it says to us not about any candidate or party, but rather our relationships with the people with which we share community.

Luther had a way of viewing the commandments not as rigid laws to be obeyed by the letter, but rather as means of grace by which we receive the love of Christ and in turn offer it to others. As such, Luther's Small Catechism explores not just the letter, but the spirit of the law. In this case, Luther tells us that not only should we "not tell lies about our neighbors, betray or slander them, or destroy their reputations," but that we should also "Come to their defense, speak well of them, and interpret everything they do in the best possible light." We can't control the honesty of others, especially politicians. But we can control how *we* talk about and treat those who think (and even vote) differently than us. Come November 6, we will all still have to deal with the people in our families, our church, and our community who voted for the option we most opposed (whichever that might be). What would it look like if everyone in this country came to the defense of, spoke well of, and interpreted everything the people on the opposite side of the aisle did in the best possible light?

Please don't misunderstand. I'm not suggesting that we abandon our convictions, or that we ignore differences of opinions for the sake of harmony. To do so would only be to add fuel to a powder keg, setting ourselves up for destructive confrontations when our fuses run out. Instead, I suggest that we examine how we talk with and about one another. When we speak of those who disagree with us, are we careful not to exaggerate or be too quick to accept rumors and wild theories that attribute the worst to them? So we assume that they hold the opinions they do out of malicious intent? To do so, at least according to Martin Luther, would be to give false testimony.

This election season, may we all obey the eighth commandment and honor the truth, especially the truth that we are all (even our neighbors who vote differently than we do) children of God in need of God's grace.


Youth musicians are invited to Lutheran Summer Music
