FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

December, 2024

"The days are surely coming, says the LORD ... "- Jeremiah 33:14a

I was one of those kids. This time of year, I couldn't wait for December 25. As soon as Thanksgiving was over, my excitement level started to rise. I was ready for the decorations, the music, the goodies, and perhaps most of all, the presents. Christmas couldn't come soon enough.

Many adults feel the same way today. Posts pining for the season to come quickly began appearing in my Facebook feed as early as October. My own mother asked me to put her Christmas tree up on November 1 this year ("You can never get started too early!"). And of course, we've all probably seen Christmas candy and decorations in the stores for at least a month now.

The season of Advent, however, calls us to slow things down by inviting us to a deeper reflection of the meaning of Christmas. In the midst of all those Christmas trappings, Advent allows us to pause and reflect on who it is that we plan to greet at the manger. It invites us to envision what his promises hold for us. It calls us to reflect on the question of theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer, who famously asked "Who is Jesus for us today"?

With that being said, it seems to me that at least one aspect of my childhood zeal for Christmas might be valuable to us this Advent season: as Christmas neared, I would often search every nook and cranny of the house looking for presents. Until they appeared wrapped under the tree, I would peek under beds, investigate the garage, and climb into the attic looking for those gifts. It drove my parents crazy.

I have since grown out of that practice. But what if we were to apply that same zeal to the promised gifts of Jesus? What if, this Advent, we searched diligently for signs of love and peace in the world? What if, in the midst of all our global (and personal) troubles, we looked for signs of hope? What if we were on the lookout this advent for ways that God may be calling us to contribute to the breaking into the world of God's kingdom?

As a child, my diligent searches rarely (if ever) amounted to much. And even if they had, they wouldn't have made Christmas Day come any more quickly. I would still have had to wait until December 25 to open and fully appreciate my gifts.

Similarly, an Advent search will not hasten the coming of God's promised kingdom, but it will bring us to a greater understanding and to a greater relationship with the manger child. Happy Advent, St. Luke!

Camp Mount Luther is thrilled to announce that it has surpassed \$1 million in capital campaign funding for facility improvements. This achievement marks a significant step toward achieving the \$1.6 million campaign goal. The camp also has a challenge goal of \$2 million.

The funds raised will have a direct impact on the hundreds of youth who visit Camp Mount Luther throughout the year. The new bathhouse will replace aging bathroom and shower facilities. It will include increased capacity, privacy, and accessibility for users. Renovations to Maple Hall, one of Camp Mount Luther's primary indoor spaces, will include three suite-style lodging rooms to offer greater hospitality and ADA accessibility for adult guests.

Chad Hershberger, executive director, says this is quite an accomplishment. "We are incredibly grateful for the generous support from our donors, volunteers, congregations, and community partners. This milestone not only reflects the commitment of our supporters but also the growing recognition of the importance of outdoor experiences in nurturing spiritual growth, wellness, and community," Hershberger said.

Children from across the area visit Camp Mount Luther through the camp's outdoor education partnership with local schools. During the summer, the camp hosts several weeks of traditional summer camp experiences. Camp Mount Luther provides for local groups retreat and rental space for reunions, conferences, hikes, and more.

The new bathhouse is expected to be ready for the summer 2025 programming. Renovation of Maple Hall will soon follow the bathhouse project. With this funding, they aim to serve more individuals and families, enhance programming, and promote inclusiveness in the great outdoors.

YOUTH WINTERFEST

Winterfest is an annual gathering hosted by the Lower Susquehanna Synod at the Wyndham Resort in Lancaster, PA, on **January 3-5, 2025**.

Winterfest gathers youth in grades 9-12, college students on winter break, and their congregational advisors for a weekend immersion in Christian community, focused around a central theme.

Large group gatherings feature keynote speakers and live music that introduce the theme, and help inspire youth and young adult attendees to think critically about how the theme intersects their daily lives.

LAZZZZZZZZZZ

Small group conversations allow participants to go deeper, and to explore the ways God may be speaking to them through the theme and the surrounding Christian community. And in between these two things are lots of opportunities for fun and fellowship!
