Last summer, I visited Europe for the first time in my life. Up to that point, I had read descriptions, seen pictures and videos, and heard accounts of visits from friends and family about the places that I visited last June. But nothing compared to the experience of actually being there in person, seeing the sights, smelling the smells, and hearing the sounds. As with most things, a personal experience of a thing is superior to learning about the thing.

For Jesus' disciple Thomas, the same dynamic was true. He had been told by the others about the resurrection of Jesus, but he wasn't going to believe it until he experienced it for himself. This has led him to gain such a strong reputation as a cynic that the expression "Doubting Thomas" appears in various dictionaries. Look it up if you don't believe me. But Thomas wasn't asking for anything more than what the other disciples had already received. He wanted their experience for his own.

As Christians, none of us will likely get the chance to put our finger "in the mark of

the nails" nor our "hand in his side" as Thomas asked for. But the life of faith in Jesus is meant to be more than just knowledge about him. We can experience the risen Christ in very real ways. Jesus is present in many different ways in our lives. When we experience community in the life of faith, Jesus is present. When we serve others, Jesus is there. When we partake of the bread and wine of communion, or rejoice in the waters of baptism, Jesus is there.

A faith that experiences the true presence of Jesus is dynamic and transformative. And yet, often times we are content to know *about* Jesus without fully experiencing him. During the season of Easter, the sermons will focus on "Encounters of the Risen Christ". Some of them will focus on Jesus' actual post-resurrection appearances, while others will see the impact that Jesus' spiritual presence had on the early church (as told in the Acts of the Apostles). All of them will connect to ways in which we experience Jesus today.



OLD IMMANUEL

Old Immanuel Lutheran Church, the "mother" church of Lutheranism in Lycoming County, will be holding its annual **Memorial Service on Sunday, June 8, 2025, at 2:30 pm.** The **Rev. Carol Johnson,** of Redeemer Lutheran Church in Williamsport, will be leading the service. The DAR will be present also to formally dedicate plaques marking the final resting place of some of the patriots buried in the cemetery.

Old Immanuel is considered to be the mother church of Lutheranism in Lycoming County. Founded in 1791, it lived until its doors shut permanently in 1920. The first structure built on the property was of log; the second and third (the current)


structures were of brick. The current building was dedicated in 1869, and contains two cornerstones, one in German dated 1832, and one in English dated 1869. At least 9 Revolutionary Soldiers and 5 Civil War Soldiers are buried in the historic cemetery. The church was built on land donated by Henry and Barbara Shoemaker, of "Shoemaker Mills" at the Routes 442/405 intersection.

This historic church is located at 2366 Lime Bluff Road, outside of Muncy. The current structure was dedicated in 1869, and has neither running water or electricity.

Old Immanuel closed its doors for regular services in 1920, after giving rise to 19 other Lutheran congregations. Some have since closed their doors, but churches that continue include Trinity and Mount Zion, Hughesville; St. Andrew, Muncy; St.

James, Muncy; Messiah, Clarkstown; St. John's, Gordner's Grove; St. John's (Brick), Montgomery; and Bethany, Montoursville. After the service is concluded, light refreshments will be served on the church lawn.
