From the Pastor's Desk November, 2025

"Do you not know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we were buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also might walk in newness of life."

-Romans 6:3-4

A few Sundays ago, before the 8:00 am service began, I announced that a date had not yet been announced for the memorial service. And as I saw brows furrow in confusion, I completed the thought: "... the memorial service for the career of (PSU head football coach) James Franklin. To provide some context, the Nittany Lions had been upset the previous day by Northwestern, a team widely considered to be far inferior. My statement was intended as a joke, but it was clear even then that Franklin's job really was in jeopardy. The loss was their third in a row (and their second in a row to an unranked team) in a season in which they had been predicted to challenge for the national championship. Sure enough, later on that day, the announcement came from State College that Coach Franklin's tenure at Penn State was over.

Even though I knew it was going to happen, I was sorry to see Coach Franklin go through the difficult experience of losing a job. But as another Franklin (Benjamin) once said: "... in this world nothing can be said to be certain, except death and taxes." We live in a finite world. Whether it be a job, an institution, a civilization, or even life itself, everything has a lifespan. Everything eventually comes to an end. Everything dies.

But the promise of the gospel is that God's love for us is eternal.

This month at St. Luke, our worship will be filled with messages of that hope:

- Depending when you receive this newsletter, we may already have had All Saints Day on **November 2**. This is a day for us to remember and celebrate all baptized believers who have died with Christ and will rise with him.
- On **November 9**, we'll hear what Jesus has to say on the topic of resurrection.
- On **November 16**, Pastor Ted Cockley will offer a message on "The Coming Messiah".
- And on **Nobvember 23**, which is **Christ the King Sunday**, we'll look at how God brings life out of death.

Jobs, institutions, even congregations like ours, will one day come to an end. But when we embrace the promises of god, we can face any of those endings with confidence in the grace of God, and we can even live into those "deaths" in ways that bring new life.

I look forward to "Experiencing the JOY" with you this month as we explore the promises of the Gospel!

30th Annual Dialysis Benefit Concert

SUNDAY, NOVENBER 16, 2025, 4:00 PM

SAVE THE DATE! You are cordially invited to join us for a special concert to support the patients and families of the Independent Dialysis Clinics. This Dialysis Benefit Concert was begun by Richard "Dick" Lakey over 30 years ago. Dick organized, facilitated and provided glorious music at concerts that raised funds to provide direct support to dialysis patients. The concert will be held on Sunday, November 16, 2025, at 4:00 pm in the sanctuary of St. Luke Lutheran Church. This year's program features organist, David A. Jackson. A reception will follow the concert in the Bell hall.

Concert proceeds support the patients of the Susquehanna Valley. Dialysis is a life-sustaining treatment which, despite technological and clinical advances, requires patients to spend four hours a day, three days a week, connected to a machine that cleans their blood and removes excess fluid. The treatment is rigorous for both the patients and their families. The concert proceeds help provide unique individual assistance to the patients: 1) through a cookbook designed to help maintain the special diet that is required; 2) through nutrition supplement such as "Nepro," a high calorie, high protein drink which helps meet the increased daily protein and calorie needs of dialysis patients and gift cards to grocery stores; 3) through materials to augment the educational and psychological needs of patients and their families; 4) and through support for transportation and physiological needs.






