From the Pastor's Desk

February 2026

"For through the law I died to the law, so that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ, and it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." – Galatians 2:19-20

I have struggled with overeating all of my life. Losing weight has never been a struggle for me, but keeping the weight off has. I have lost significant amounts of weight roughly half a dozen times in my life. But every time I did it, I would lapse back into poor eating habits and gain it all back, usually shortly after the loss stopped.

On April 1, 2024, I decided to try something new: intermittent fasting. There are various ways of doing it, but the method I choose was to go 16 straight hours without eating and then allowing myself an 8 hour eating window every day (for the record, my window was 8:00 am until 4:00 pm). Not only did it work (I lost 40 pounds!), but for the first time in my life, I was able to sustain it. Since losing the weight, I do a slightly shorter fast every day, and it has helped me to hover at around the same weight for over a year.

I want to be very clear: I am **not** writing about this to brag, nor do I necessarily wish to encourage you to follow this method. It isn't for everyone, and it's always a good idea to consult with a health professional (not your pastor!) before engaging in any significant dietary change. I believe, however, that some of the insights I gained from this experience are applicable to our spiritual lives, especially as we enter the season of Lent.

In the early centuries of Christianity, new converts to the faith were expected to undergo an intense period of preparation, which could last as long as a few years. The final forty days leading to baptism (on Easter) were an especially intense time of spiritual discipline: particularly involving prayer and fasting. Over time, the church began to value this period of preparation not only for new members, but as an opportunity for spiritual renewal among both long time members and those who had fallen away. Thus, the season of Lent was born as a time of spiritual preparation.

How does my diet fit into all of this? One of the things that I found to be the most helpful about intermittent fasting is that it drew attention to the unhealthy patterns of eating I had fallen into. I ate when I was hungry, of course. But I also ate when I was bored, when I was stressed, and when I was depressed. I was using food to fulfill purposes that food can never fulfill. Instituting a fast in the evening when I was often less busy (and on my own), helped me to avoid eating more than my body needed during the times that I was most prone to do so. But it did two additional things in particular: it gave me an opportunity to reflect on my unhealthy habits, and it created in me a greater appreciation for what food can do for me. By the end of each fasting period, I found myself craving, not just a meal, but a nutritious one that would provide new energy.

Spiritual disciplines like prayer and fasting can provide similar benefits. They can help us become more aware of our own limitations and weaknesses, giving us insight into the patterns of destructiveness that arise out of our sin. But the good news is that these disciplines can also point us to (and even help us crave) the new possibilities offered to us in Jesus Christ.

The season of Lent is an invitation for us to enter into a time of spiritual practice that can deepen our faith. But our approach to those practices is key. Whatever way you choose to observe the season, I encourage you to do it with humility and expectation, seeking –in the words of the apostle Paul – “the one who loved and gave himself for us.”

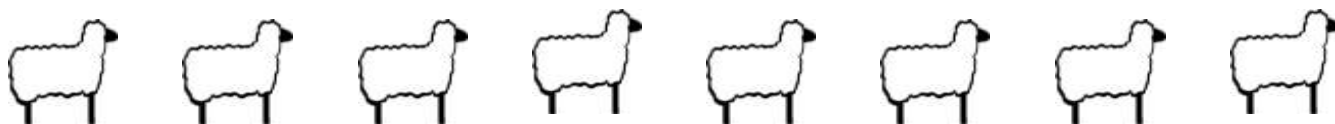
SHEPHERD OF THE STREETS SUNDAY

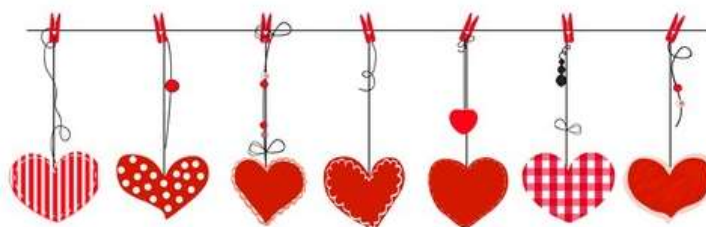
